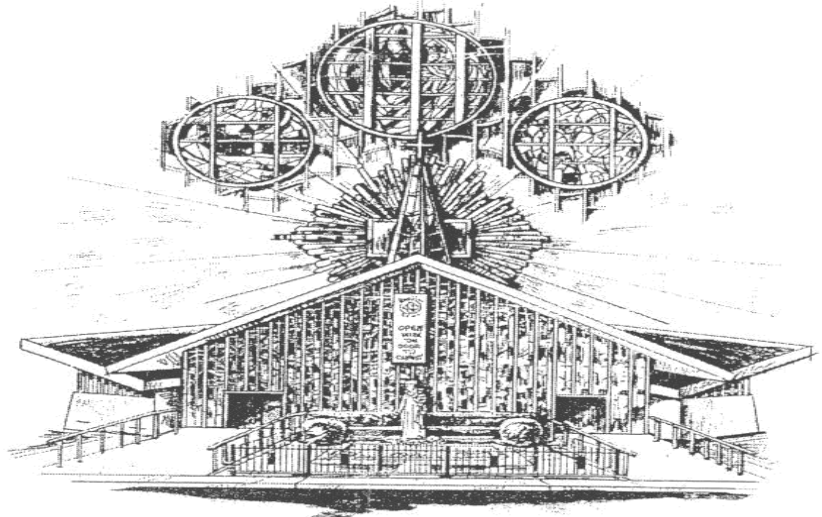

Dear Friends:

I had a renewing vacation and retreat in Philadelphia but am happy to be home. I was able to visit the tombs of two American Saints while I was there. If you ever visit that historic city of the Founding Fathers, Independence Hall and the Liberty Bell you can also learn some Church history and venerate some heroes of faith as well.

St. John Neumann was ordained a diocesan priest in New York in 1836 before becoming a Redemptorist priest and ministered in and became the Archbishop of Philadelphia at age 41. He founded the Sisters of St. Francis who have the retreat center where I stayed. They are an international congregation and have many ministries throughout the United States. He is also considered the secondary founder of the School Sisters of Notre Dame in the US. He began and fostered the celebration of the 40 hours Diocesan Eucharistic Adoration and created a diocesan Catholic school system in Philadelphia which was adopted by other bishops of the US.

It is interesting that St. Francis Xavier Seelos, buried in New Orleans, was also a Redemptorist priest and lived in a rectory with St. John Neumann. Neumann was born in Bohemia in 1811 and studied in Italy before coming to America. He used his knowledge of eight languages to minister to the German, Italian, Irish and other immigrants in the US while serving the English speakers as well. He became a US citizen in 1848 and died in 1860. Known for his holy life, his childlike gentleness, his hard labor and his tremendous foresight he was venerated by people for years until being canonized a saint in 1977. Katherine Drexel was born in 1858 of a wealthy devout Catholic Philadelphian family who used her inheritance to support Catholic churches, schools and ministries throughout the US. After her parents died she founded the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament in 1891 to work among the Black and Native Americans of the US. She is well known in New Orleans for the founding of Xavier University as well as Drexel Academy (Xavier Prep) and other schools. She died in 1955 at the age of 96 having lived a life of prayer and poverty to serve Christ and others. She was canonized in 2000.

I used a do it yourself retreat book "Consoling the Heart of Jesus" by Fr. Michael Gaitley, MIC for three days of prayer. I highly recommend it. It is written in simple language and teaches basic prayers

and devotions while focusing on the love and mercy of Christ. If you are interested, contact me and I can show you the book and give details about using it. I hope all of you had some time to rest and relax during the summer as we prepare for the new school year and return to our usual work and prayer routine.
