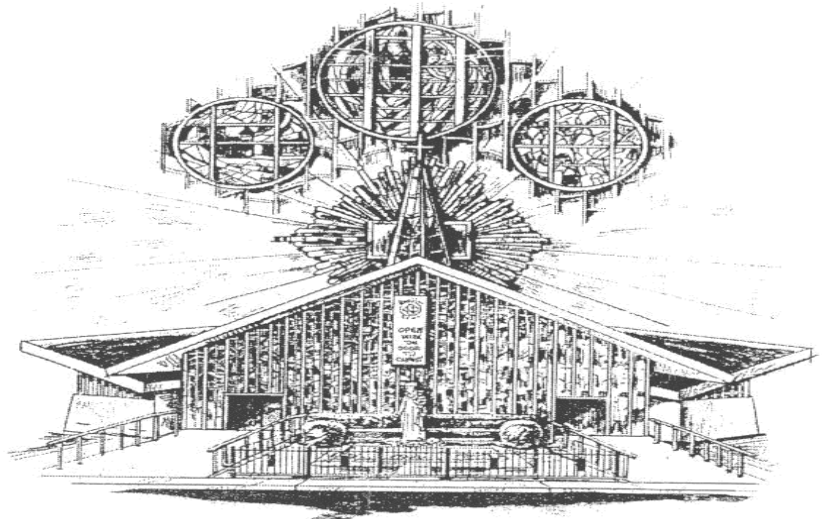

## The Corporal and Spiritual works of Mercy

The works of mercy are charitable actions motivated by Christian love by which we help our neighbor obtain what he or she needs spiritually and materially. Instructing, advising, consoling, and comforting are Spiritual Works of Mercy, as are forgiving and bearing wrongs patiently.

The Corporal Works of Mercy consist especially in feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and burying the dead. The Works of Mercy are not optional but are absolutely essential to living the Christian life of holiness and goodness. (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2447)

### **Mercy**

Mercy is God's unconditional, loving care for humanity reflected throughout all of history in God's desire to be close to all people—to be in an intimate, loving relationship with us. As Pope Francis explains in his announcement of this special Jubilee Year, mercy is “the bridge that connects God and humanity, opening our hearts to the hope of being loved forever despite our sinfulness.” So, while mercy first of all comes from God, for it is central to who God is, mercy likewise is something that God invites us to show to others in order to truly live as children of God. (Further reflection: Luke 15)

### **Forgiveness**

There are two distinct but related aspects of forgiveness. The first is letting go of anger or resentment toward those who have committed an offense. The second aspect of forgiveness is releasing them from the obligation of repayment. The Lord's Prayer radically connects our own plea for the Father's forgiveness with our willingness to forgive others. If we cling to our anger and resentment toward those who have wronged us, we will be cut off from the Father's forgiveness—not because God ceases to offer it, but because our hardened hearts cannot receive it. (CCC, #2840) (Further reflection: Matthew 18:21-35)
